

Join a study on adults with Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD)

What is the study about?

Many adults with ASD have, or want to have, children of their own. Have you wondered what is the chance of having a child with ASD when one or both parents have ASD? No studies have yet looked at this outcome. This new study seeks to:

- (i) estimate these numbers and the risk of recurrence
- (ii) understand parents' concerns and needs related to risk information and family planning.

Who can participate?

- individuals 18 years of age or older with a formal or suspected diagnosis of ASD
- a parent(s) whose child has a formal or suspected diagnosis of ASD and is 18 years of age or older

What's involved?

You will be asked to complete an anonymous online survey, which should take 5-10 minutes to complete.

Why should I participate?

The information gathered in the surveys will help health-care professionals better understand recurrence risk for adults with ASD and help them guide family planning discussions among adults with ASD.
